Open daily August thru November

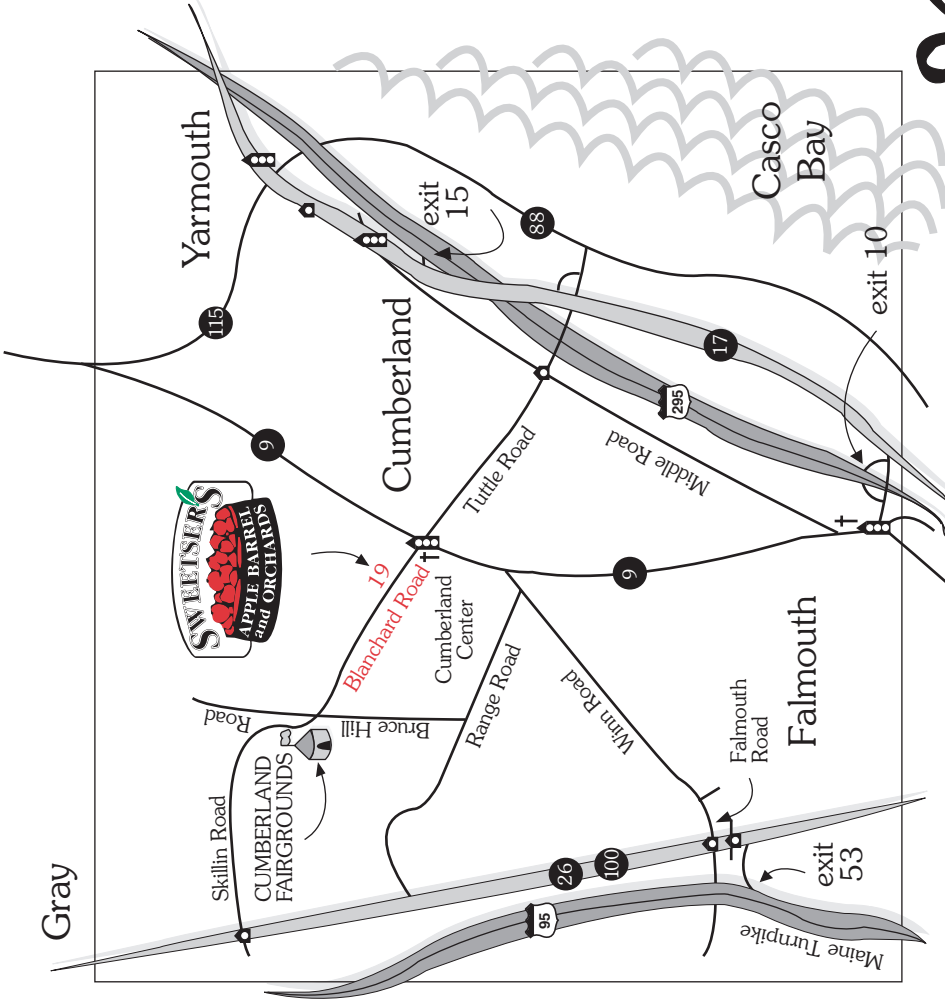

From South on 95, Maine Turnpike:
Take exit 53, West Falmouth
After toll booths, turn left on 26. At the second light, turn right onto Falmouth Road, then bear left at the Y onto Winn Road. After 3 miles, Winn ends at Route 9; turn left. About 1 mile up Route 9 look for a stop light and a white church on the left; turn left here onto Blanchard Road and find Apple Barrel just down the road on the right-hand side.



Gift Packs of apples shipped during October

From North on 295:
Take exit 15, Yarmouth/Cumberland.
At stop, turn left onto Route 1, go about 1 mile and take left turn just before overpass up to Tuttle. Turn right on Tuttle, pass over Route 1 and on US 295, go through flashing light and on up Tuttle a bit over 3 miles. At Route 9 junction is a stop light and a white church. Cross Route 9 (Tuttle becomes Blanchard here) and find Apple Barrel just down the road on the right-hand side.

From South on 295:
Take exit 10, Falmouth/Bucknam Road.
At stop, turn right and cross over US 295. At light, turn right onto Route 9. There is soon a church on the right, then a Y; stay left on Route 9. About 4.5 miles up Route 9 is a stop light and a white church on the left; turn left here onto Blanchard Road and find Apple Barrel just down the road on the right-hand side.
